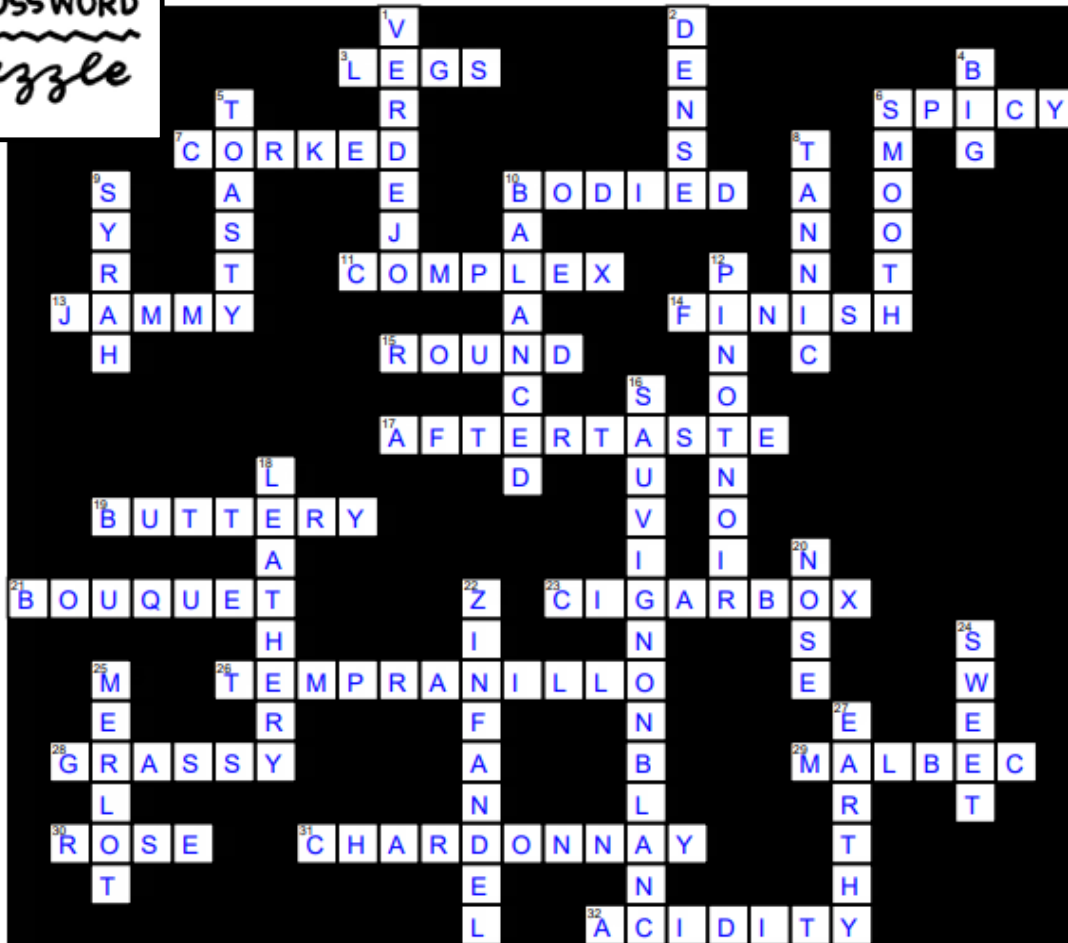

- 10. A wine is usually described as being light, medium or full \_\_\_\_\_
- 11. This characteristic is used to describe a wine with many layers of flavors and aromas, not simple
- 13. A flavor associated with wine that is rich in berry fruit flavors such as a Zinfandel
- 14. The sense of the wine after swallowing is the \_\_\_\_\_
- 15. A wine with this characteristic has a good body and is low in tannins, not flat
- 17. The sensation left on the palate after wine has been swallowed
- 19. The wine characteristic that is the result of malolactic fermentation

- 30. A type of wine made from red grapes, produced with reduced time fermenting with grape skins, giving it a pink hue
- 31. A full bodied white wine that has buttery flavors when oaked, and more fruit flavors when unoaked
- 32. Wines with high \_\_\_\_\_ taste tart and zesty
- 1. A Spanish white wine with crisp and fresh fruit flavors, grows particularly well in the Dunnigan Hills region of California
- 2. This heavy characteristic is used to describe bold red wines such as Cabernet Sauvignon
- 4. A wine with intense flavor, that is not thin or small
- 5. The charred or smoky taste from an oaked wine
- 6. A soft texture found in wine, often associated with an even surface
- 8. This is detected by the drying sensation felt on the teeth, gums, tongue and inner cheeks
- 9. This wine is often blended with Grenache and Mourvèdre to create the popular GSM blend
- 10. A wine that incorporates all its main components—tannins, acid, sweetness, and alcohol
- 12. A light bodied red wine often with light cherry flavors and a soft, smooth finish (2 words)
- 16. A light bodied white wine with citrus-driven flavors, grows particularly well in New Zealand (2 words)
- 18. This describes a red wine high in tannins, with a rough texture such as a saddle
- 20. The aroma, smell or bouquet of a wine
- 22. This wine is a medium-bodied red wine, known for being fruit-forward and spicy
- 24. A wine with a noticeable sense of sugar levels
- 25. A wine with red fruit flavors, easy tannins and a soft finish, often used in Bordeaux Blends
- 27. This can mean a wine with aromas and flavor reminiscent of a forest floor or mushrooms.
